WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Tennessee finds that broadband internet availability in Franklin County, Tennessee is of critical importance to all people living, visiting and doing business in Franklin County, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee State Legislature recently created the ability for Tennessee communities be designated as "Broadband Ready Communities" through the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Tennessee seeks to promote private investment in broadband infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Tennessee seeks to be designated as a Broadband Ready Community pursuant to Tennessee *Public Chapter 228*, § 4-3-709:

Public Chapter 228, § 4-3-709 (a)(1) A political subdivision may apply to the department of economic and community development for designation as a "broadband ready community" pursuant to guidelines established by the department. The guidelines for designation must include a requirement that the political subdivision has adopted an efficient and streamlined ordinance or policy for reviewing applications and issuing permits related to projects relative to broadband services.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County is of the opinion that such a designation as described would be of great benefit to the citizens of the County and should therefore be established.

- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Tennessee, meeting in its regular session on this 17TH day of September, 2018, that:
- 1. As used in this chapter, "permit" means any local permit, license, certificate, approval, registration, or similar form of approval required by policy, administrative rule, regulation, or ordinance with respect to a project.
- 2. As used in this chapter, "project" means the construction or deployment of wireline or wireless communications facilities to provide communications services in a unit.
- 3: Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution by Franklin County, Tennessee, the following shall apply to a project:

- (A) Tennessee Certified Broadband Ready Community has an affirmative duty to notify the Tennessee Economic and Community Development Department (TNECD) of any changes to the information submitted as part of its application.
- (B) Failure to notify TNECD of changes may result in revocation of Franklin County, Tennessee's Broadband Ready Certification.

RESOLUTION TO AMEND SECTION 3 OF THE FISCAL YEAR 2018/19 APPROPRIATIONS RESOLUTION IN REGARD TO INTER-CATEGORY BUDGET AMENDMENT PROCESS ACCORDING TO T.C.A. §5-9-407(d)

WHEREAS, certain amendments are needed to provide for compliance with audit requirements to not overspend allocated amounts in different expenditure lines within a major category; and

WHEREAS, Franklin County Finance Policies and Procedures allow for such amendments that adhere to T.C.A. §5-9-407 in Section 7.3; and

WHEREAS, it is required by the Comptroller of the State of Tennessee that this specific language be provided for in Section 3 of the annual Appropriations Resolution;

NOW THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the county legislative body of Franklin County, meeting in regular session, this 17th day of September, 2018, that:

The Franklin County, Tennessee Appropriations Resolution for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 (Exhibit "A") be amended as follows:

SECTION 1. "Section 3" language be replaced by the following:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any amendment to the budget, except for amendments to the budget for funds under supervision of the director of schools and highway superintendent, shall be approved as follows: Prior to the county mayor's approval, the official or department head of the office or department whose budget is to be amended shall make a written amendment request on the amendment request form specified by the county mayor to include the information outlined in subdivision (b) (1) – (3) of T.C.A. §5-9-407. If the county mayor fails to approve such an amendment request, the amendment request may be approved by the finance committee, or by a majority vote of the county legislative body. Amendments shall be reported to the county legislative body at the next regular scheduled commission meeting. The director of schools must receive approval of the Board of Education for transfers between major categories and the highway superintendent must receive approval of the highway commission for transfers between major categories as required by law.

SECTION 2. This resolution shall take effect upon adoption regarding inter-category amendments within the dates of July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019, the general welfare requiring it.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Franklin County Schools' Federal Projects Fund for the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) projects shall be the budget approved for the separate projects within the fund by the Franklin County Board of Education. Be it further resolved that the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA – Part B and Preschool) and Carl Perkins Vocational projects shall be the budget approved for the separate projects within the fund by the Franklin County Board of Education and the Tennessee Department of Education. This budget includes a \$100,000 TRANS inter-fund loan transfer from the School General Fund to the Federal Projects Fund for operational purposes and a redemption upon year end 2019, then transferred back by June 30, 2019.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there are also hereby appropriated certain portions of the commissions and fees for collecting taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register and the Sheriff and their officially authorized deputies and assistants may severally be entitled to receive under State laws heretofore or hereafter enacted. Expenditures out of commissions, and/or fees collected by the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register and the Sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any court having power to make such appropriations. Any excess commissions and/or fees collected over and above the expenditures duly and conclusively authorized shall be paid over to the Trustee and converted into the General Fund as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any fee officials, as enumerated in Section 8-22-101, T.C.A., operate under provisions of Section 8-22-104, T.C.A., provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any amendment to the budget shall be approved as provided for in Section 5-9-407, T.C.A. One copy of each amendment shall be filed with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Financial Management Committee, and one with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any appropriations made by this resolution which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages or remuneration of each officer, employee or agent of the county shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures of any office, agency, institution, division or department for the year ending June 30, 2019. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the year in which the expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the Comptroller of the State or his Designee after its adoption as provided by Section 9-21-403, T.C.A.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Executive and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, provided such notes are first approved by the Comptroller of the State of Tennessee or his Designee, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the year 2018-19 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the applicable sections of Title 9, Chapter 21, T.C.A. Said notes shall be signed by the County Executive and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 2019.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all revenues realized as a result of the participation by the Sheriff's Department in the Federal Meth Task Force Program & the Organized Crime Drug Task Force for overtime reimbursement will be then in turn appropriated to the Sheriff's Department Overtime Pay line upon receipt. As well Equitable Shared funds from the US Marshalls office shall be accounted for within the Drug Fund and stipulated as Equitably Shared resources and expenditures.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the funds which have been appropriated to provide property tax relief to low-income elderly homeowners (County Commission – Tax Relief Program) will be dispersed by the County Trustee pursuant to the criteria established by resolution of the Franklin County Board of Commissioners on September 11, 2000.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Franklin County Commission on the date of 21st April 2008 approved participation in the Tennessee Property Tax Freeze Program pursuant to T.C.A. 67-5-705. The tax freeze program is provided for in Chapter 581 of the Public Acts of 2007 and shall be effective for the tax roll of 2008 forward and administered as such.

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the delinquent County Property taxes for the year 2016 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2019 shall be apportioned to the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 2017. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 11. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Franklin County Commission on the date of June 20, 2011 & amended on August 15, 2011, December 5, 2011 & April 15, 2013, they resolved to establish a Reserve Fund Policy, Spending Prioritization Policy & Debt Management Policies of Franklin County, TN. The Policies enacted will be utilized n the Financial Administration and Budgeting Process to assist in making sound decisions related to managing fund balances, spending & debt payments of all Franklin County, Tennessee funds.

SECTION 12. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the year shall lapse, and shall be of no effect at the end of the year at June 30, 2019.

SECTION 13. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any resolution or part of a resolution which has heretofore been passed by the Board of County Commissioners which is in conflict with any provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 14. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 2018. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

EXHIBIT "A"

LEASE AGREEMENT

This Agreement made and entered into this 1ST day of September, 2018 by FRANKLIN COUNTY TENNESSEE, hereinafter called the "Landlord") and SOUTH CENTRAL TENNESSEE DEVELOMENT DISTRICT, hereinafter called "Tenant". Any and all previous lease agreements between bargainers shall be rendered null and void.

WITNESSTH

Upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set out, the Landlord hereby leases to Tenant the following described real estate, hereinafter referred to as "Premises", located in the Townsend School Property, Franklin County, Winchester, Tennessee, 37398 to-wit:

Being approximately 900 square feet of office space and parking area for the American Job Center partners and public.

- 1. The term of this lease is for a period of one (1) year beginning on September 1, 2018, and ending on June 30, 2019, unless sooner terminated as hereinafter provided. The lease is automatically renewable on annual basis unless one party wishes to terminate. A 60 day notice is required by either party to terminate. It is understood that if funding is terminated or lost, the lease may be terminated upon a sixty (60) day notice.
- 2. Tenant agrees to pay to Landlord at their mailing address 855 Dinah Shore Blvd., Winchester, Franklin County, Tennessee 37398, the sum of Five Hundred and no/100's Dollars (\$500.00) per month per month as an all-inclusive lease for the premises to include: utilities, internet, janitorial services, building services, and parking. Due in advance on the first day of each month hereunder.
- 3. Landlord shall pay all utilities connected with the use of the premises, which shall include, but are not limited to, all charges for gas, electricity, lights, heat, and power.
- 4. It is expressly understood and agreed by the parties that the premises shall be used for the following purpose and none other:

AMERICAN JOB CENTER

5. Tenant accepts the Premises and any buildings and improvements thereon, in their existing condition, latent defects accepted, and agrees to surrender same in as good order and condition as when received, ordinary wear and tear accepted. Landlord shall under the terms hereof make all repairs as shall be reasonably necessary to keep Premises in good condition, which shall include but are

not limited to replacement of ballasts, maintenance and or replacement of HVAC units, plumbing, electrical. Doors and glass, (all maintenance will be the responsibility of the Tenant). Landlord will be responsible for all common areas. Landlord has the right of inspection at any reasonable time. It is understood that unforeseen building maintenance may generate a need for cost allocation. Therefore, an escalation clause for capital and major repairs is agreed upon if particular factors beyond the control of either party affecting the value has been determined.

- 6. It is agreed that Landlord shall not be liable and Tenant hereby covenants to indemnify and hold harmless Landlord, for any damage or injury to property or person of Tenant, growing out its use of the Premises, its agents, employees and servants, and Tenants hereby assumes all such risks, damage or injury caused by the willful misconduct or negligent act of the Landlord, its agent or employee excepted. Tenant agrees to maintain, at its expense, liability insurance on the Premises against property damage or personal injury, in the amount of at least One Million and no/100's Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) with Franklin County, Tennessee listed as the additional insured in said policy
- 7. Tenant shall not, without written consent of Landlord first endorsed on this Agreement, sublet or assign this lease.
- 8. All improvements placed upon the Premises by Tenant shall be done at Tenant's expense, and same shall become a part of the Premises, with the exception of any and all portable buildings which may be removed by Tenant at the end of this lease, providing all conditions and covenants have been fulfilled hereunder. Nothing herein contained shall prevent Tenant from removing office structures which shall be placed upon the Premises by Tenant; however Tenant shall be responsible for all damages caused by the removal of such structures. Tenant shall not make additions, deletions or alterations to said Premises without prior consent of Landlord.
- 9. Tenant shall have the right to place upon the Premises the usual signs which are fitting, suitable and proper for Tenant's business, provided, however, that such signs shall be placed so as to not violate local laws, ordinances and regulations or any governmental authority. Signage is subject to approval by Landlord.
- 10. In the event of the initiation of any insolvency or bankruptcy proceedings against Tenant, Landlord shall have the right, at their option, to immediately declare this Agreement null and void and to recover possession of Premises.
- 11. Failure to pay the rent when due shall give Landlord the right to terminate this Agreement upon the giving of ten days written notice of their intention to so terminate, and the continuing default of Tenant within ten business days after mailing of said notice by Landlord. Tenant shall remain liable for all its obligations under this Lease despite any reentry by Landlord, and Landlord may, at their option, reenter and use legal requirements for notice of intention to reenter and right of redemption.
- 12. If Tenant shall be in default in the performance of any of the covenants hereunder, Landlord shall have the option to terminate said Lease upon the giving of ten days written notice to Tenant of their intention to terminate and if such default is

not cured within ten days after notice thereof is given by Landlord.

- 13. Tenant agrees to pay a reasonable attorney's fee in the event of the employment of an attorney by Landlord to enforce any of the provisions of this Lease Agreement, provided Landlord prevails on the issue.
- 14. Nothing in the Lease Agreement shall be deemed to require Landlord to give Tenant any notice, other than such notice as may be required by statute, proper to the commencement of any unlawful detainer action, it being intended by the parties that the ten day notice is only for the purpose of creating a conditional limitation hereunder pursuant to which this Agreement shall terminate.
- 15. All rights and liabilities herein give to all imposed upon with other parties hereto shall extend to the heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns of said parties.

FRANKLIN COUNTY DEAD STOCK REMOVAL SERVICE AGREEMENT

This Dead Stock Removal Service Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between South Central Tennessee Development District (the "District") and Franklin County, Tennessee ("County"), this 1st day of July, 2018.

- 1. For and in consideration of the sum of Sixty Thousand Four Hundred Ninety Two and 50/100 Dollars (\$60,492.50), the County hereby agrees that the District appoints a Provider to provide exclusive removal and disposal services for all dead livestock within the County. This sum shall be paid as follows: either (1) a lump sum payment consisting of the balance of the contractual sum on the date of execution of this Agreement; or (2) half of the contractual sum due upon the execution of this Agreement with the remaining balance to be paid on or before April 1, 2019. For purposes of this instrument, "dead livestock" shall include all farm or domesticated animals weighing in excess of 75 pounds. Provider reserves the right to refuse service of any dead livestock only in the event that the disposal of said animal would violate Provider's agreement with the landfill or other entity accepting the carcasses for disposal.
- 2. This agreement shall be for an initial term of twelve (12) months commencing on July 1, 2018. This agreement is the final and complete agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior agreement, oral or written. The parties will enter into good faith negotiations to extend this Agreement within thirty (30) days of the end of the term of this Agreement unless the Agreement has been otherwise terminated. In good faith both parties agree that after satisfactory performance of this short term stop-gap agreement, Provider will be allowed to compete for longer term agreements.
- 3. Provider will provide removal service within 48 hours of notification, five days a week, excluding holidays. There is no guarantee that after hours call-in for next day pick-up can be honored; however Provider will make every effort to accommodate late call-in requests and in any event will remove the carcass within the next forty-eight (48) hours. If the late call-in request cannot be accommodated, the caller will be advised during the call by Ms. Pope or Ms. Sherrill.
- 4. All dead livestock shall be placed within 25 feet of gravel or paved surface to permit access without interference from any fence, building, structure or other obstacle, and accessible to a utility-type grapple vehicle. Provider will only be required to go to the specified pick up location. All locations must be generally accessible by a GPS system. Contact phone numbers must be provided at time of pick-up request.
- 5. Dead livestock shall be ready for removal prior to Provider's arrival. Dead animals must not be submerged in water or ice, or put into inaccessible ditches or low lying landfalls. Animals must not be severely deteriorated or have other animals feasting on the carcasses.

- 6. Provider will dump carcasses at Allied Waste at Middle Point Landfill in Murfreesboro, or an alternate site to be designated by District, by 3:30 p.m. each business day. If another disposal site is chosen by District and is farther from Provider's current central office than the Middle Point Landfill, the parties will negotiate a disposal surcharge to be paid to Provider to compensate Provider for the increased mileage. Provider will obtain weight tickets for all loads dumped and will provide these tickets to District on a monthly basis. In the event that Allied Waste refuses to accept the carcasses, and an alternate site is not feasible or cannot be secured, this Agreement will terminate upon written notice to County by District or Provider. In the event of a termination for the reasons set forth in this Paragraph, County's recourse/remedy shall be limited to termination of this Agreement, and the parties agree that District shall have no liability for any claims or damages resulting from such termination. County will be responsible for the cost of any services delivered prior to such a termination, but will have no further responsibility to Provider or District.
- 7. County residents shall remain responsible for all livestock while Provider performs its service.
- 8. County and/or District may terminate this Agreement due to nonperformance by Provider upon ten (10) days advance written notice to Provider.
- 9. The parties agree that Provider is an independent contractor, and shall not be deemed an employee of County or District. County agrees to hold the District harmless from any claims or damages caused by or related to any default and/or non-performance by Provider. Likewise, County agrees to hold the District harmless from any claims or damages caused by or related to the inability of Provider to secure a site to dispose of animal carcasses.
- 10. Provider shall obtain general liability insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence, naming both County and District as additional insured. Provider indemnifies County and District, and holds each harmless for any claim or loss which occurs during or results from the performance of Provider's duties under this agreement. Provider shall obtain worker's compensation insurance to cover its employees. Proof of any insurance required under this Agreement shall be provided upon request by any party.
- 11. In the event of an extraordinary event or series of events resulting in carcasses exceeding an aggregate weight of 10,000 pounds, the County will be responsible to reimburse District for all charges related to carcass disposal exceeding 10,000 pounds of aggregate weight per extraordinary event.
- 12. Should laws and regulations be adopted during the term of this agreement that would materially affect Provider's ability to perform these services, Provider reserves the right to renegotiate this agreement or terminate it upon 30 days advance written notice.
