Purpose: To allow the development of a Residential Subdivision and/or any Use Permitted in an R-1, Single Family Residential zoned district.
Existing Zoning: A, Agricultural.
Location: 5th Civil District; Parcel 14.00 (Part), Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 94, located on Post Oak Road, Horseshoe Lane, and Glaus Road.
Size: A portion (19.94 +/- acres), of a 164.49 +/- acre parcel.
Existing Land Use: Open and agricultural.
Surrounding Land Use and Zoning:
North – Residential, Agricultural, and A, Agricultural.
South – Residential, and A, Agricultural.
East – Residential, Open, Agricultural, and A, Agricultural.
West – Wooded, and A, Agricultural.

Applicable Regulations: Franklin County Zoning Resolution - Article X, Section 3 (Page 80); Article VI, Section 1 (Page 36); and Article XV (Page 117).

Specific Information

Previous Actions: The parcel was zoned A, Agricultural with the Adoption of Zoning in 1974.
Access: The subject portion of the parcel fronts Post Oak Road for approximately 925', Horseshoe Lane for approximately 1927', and Glaus Road for approximately 545'. Post Oak Road is a county road with a 50' R-O-W and an asphalt surface. Horseshoe Lane is a county road with a 30' R-O-W and a gravel surface. Glaus Road is a county road with a 40' R-O-W (see note #5 on survey) and a DBST surface.
Utilities: A two and one half (2½) inch water line runs along the south side of Post Oak Road. Potable water is provided by Belvidere Utilities. Power is provided by the Duck River Electric Membership Corporation. Sanitary

waste disposal is assumed to be by individual septic tank systems. Solid waste disposal is by utilizing the county convenience center.

Fire Protection: Fire protection service is provided by the Belvidere Rural Volunteer Fire Department. There are no fire hydrants located in the general area.

Other Public Services: Police protection is provided by the Franklin County Sheriff's Department.

Drainage/Flood: Drainage is generalized to the southwest. There are no apparent low-lying or ponding areas on the sites, according to the USGS Quad Map. The site is not in an identified FEMA flood hazard area per Map No. 47051C0140E .

Area Characteristics: The immediate and general areas are characterized by agricultural activities with residential activities scattered along the roadways.

Planning Jurisdiction: The site is located within the Franklin County Regional Planning Commission's jurisdiction.

Site Visit: 6-18-19

Other: The applicant is proposing the development of a seven (7) lot subdivision. The Agricultural zoned district does not allow for the development of a Residential Subdivision with more than six (6) lots.

Staff recommends the rezoning of a portion of the subject parcel from A, Agricultural to R-1, Single Family Residential as requested.

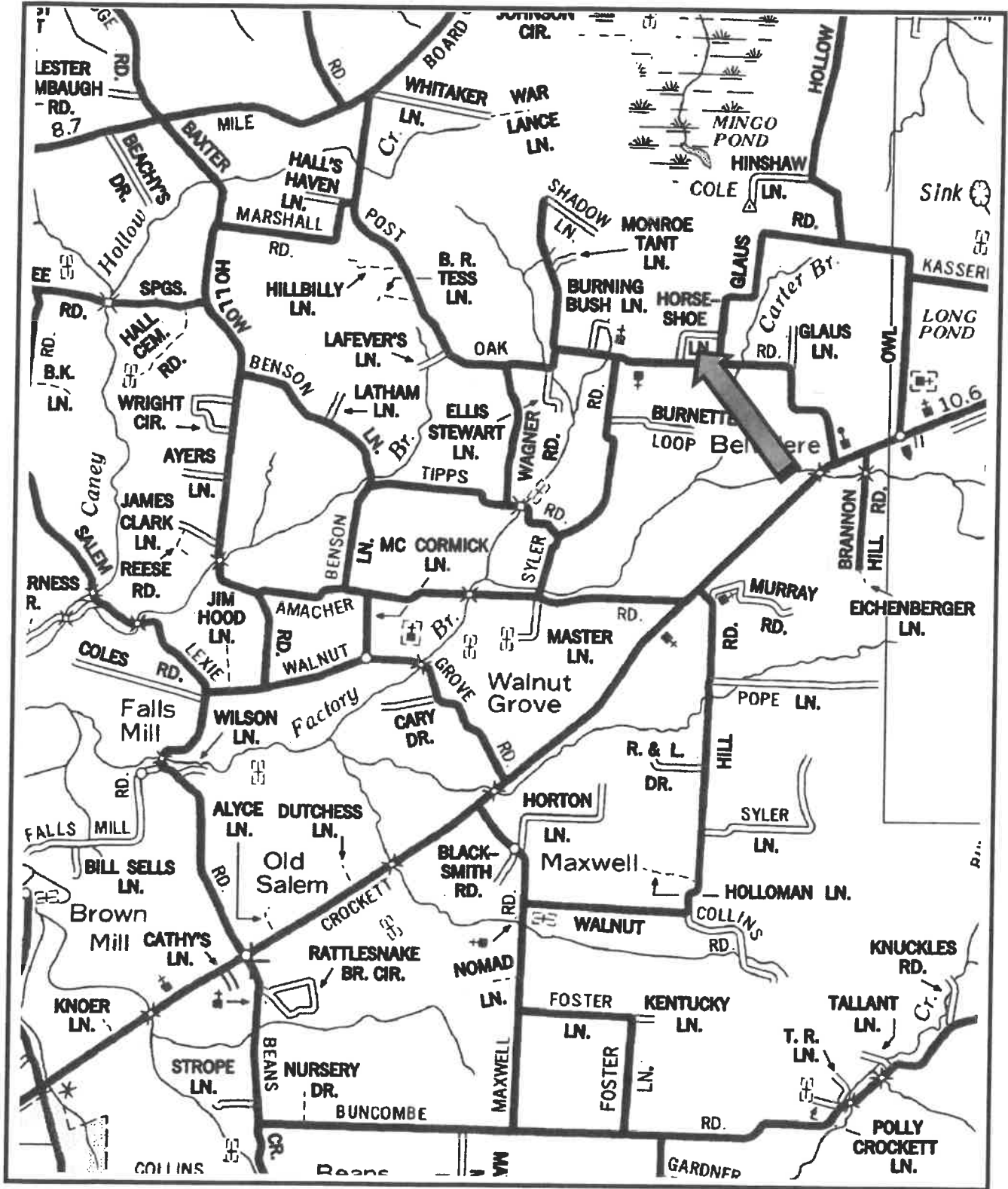

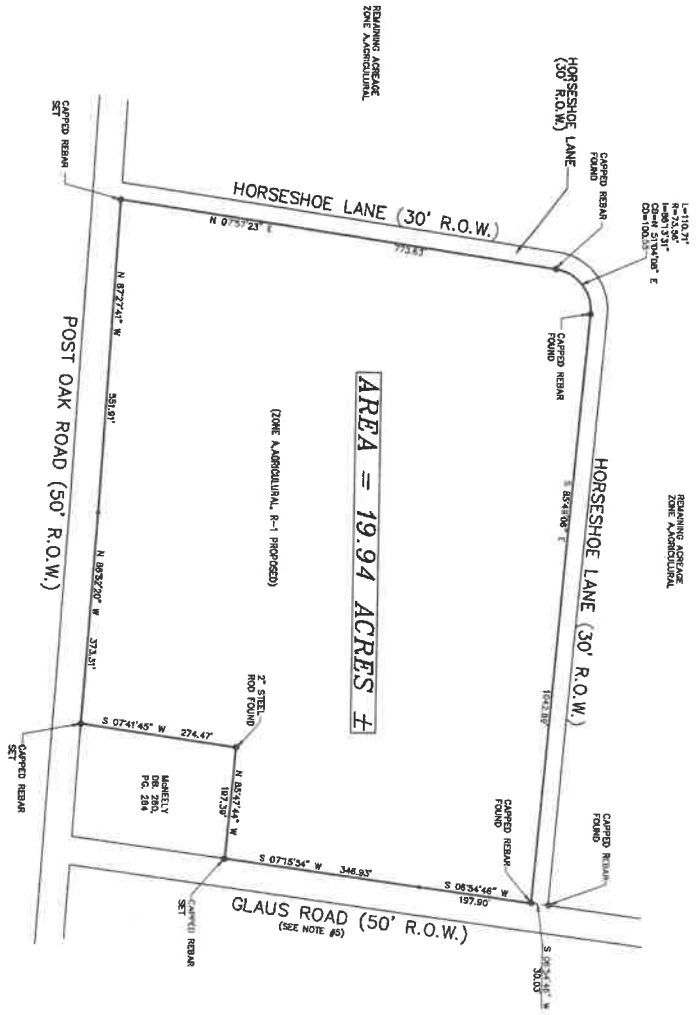

Power is provided by the Duck River Electric Membership Corporation. Sanitary waste disposal is assumed to be by individual septic tank systems. Solid waste disposal is by utilizing the county convenience center.

Fire Protection: Fire protection service is provided by the 4th District Rural Volunteer Fire Department. There are no fire hydrants located in the general area.

Other Public Services: Police protection is provided by the Franklin County Sheriff's Department.

Drainage/Flood: Drainage is generalized to the southwest. There are no apparent low-lying or ponding areas on the sites, according to the USGS Quad Map. The site is not in an identified FEMA flood hazard area per Map No. 47051C0163E .

Area Characteristics: The immediate and general areas are characterized by agricultural activities with residential activities scattered along the roadways.

Planning Jurisdiction: The site is located within the Franklin County Regional Planning Commission's jurisdiction.

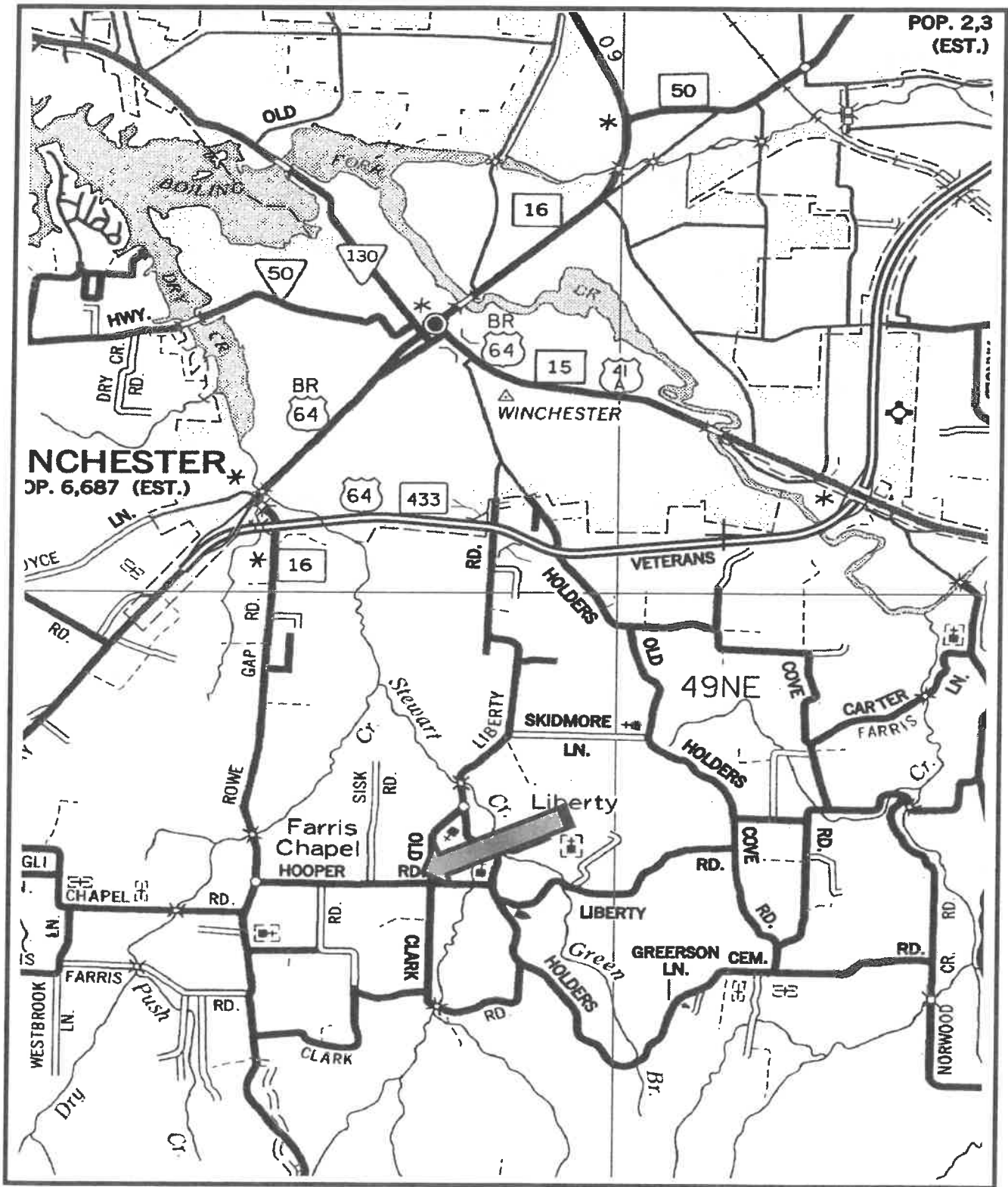

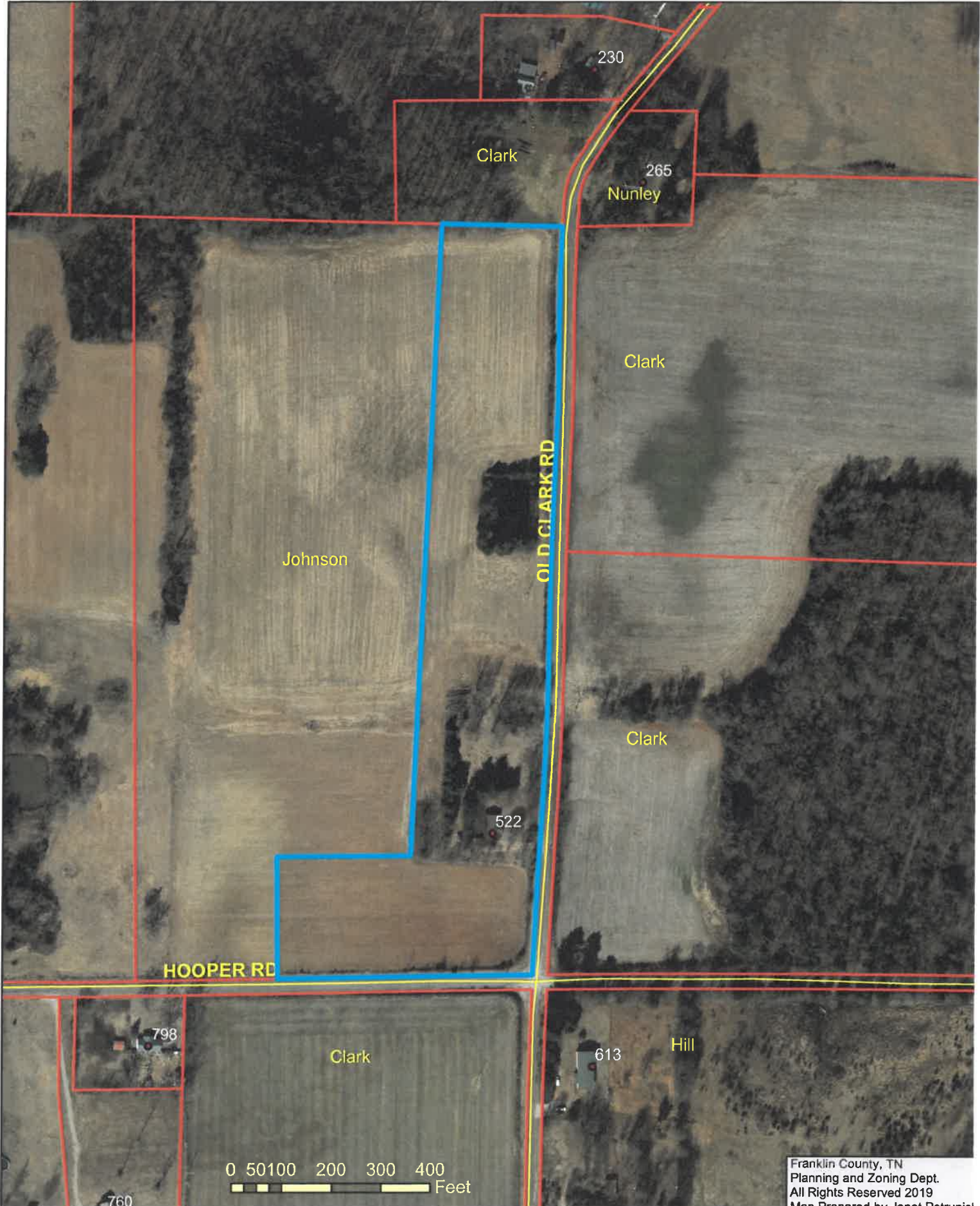

The Franklin County Regional Planning Commission – June 25, 2019.

The Franklin County Regional Planning Commission met in a regular session on June 25, 2019 at 6:00 PM in the Franklin County Courthouse.

The members present were Chairman Dave Van Buskirk, Vice Secretary David James, John Woodall, Michael Rudder and Lydia Curtis Johnson. Also present was Planning and Zoning Director/Building Commissioner Janet Petrunich. A Visitors' List is attached.

The minutes for the April 30, 2019 meeting were approved as written on a motion by John Woodall, seconded by David James. All aye.

Dave Van Buskirk addressed the audience, describing the procedures and protocol of the meeting.

Dave Van Buskirk introduced Case No. 05-19; Rezoning; Applicant: Kurt Johnson. Location – 5th Civil District; Parcel 14.00 (Part), Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 94, located on Post Oak Road, Horseshoe Lane, and Glaus Road. Janet Petrunich read the Staff Report. There were no returned adjoining property owner notices. Mr. Warmbrod, property owner on the south side of Post Oak Road expressed his opposition to the rezoning, due to future increased number of houses and traffic in the area. David James made a motion to recommend for the rezoning from A, Agricultural to R-1, Single Family Residential. Lydia Curtis-Johnson seconded the motion. All aye.

Dave Van Buskirk introduced Case No. 06-19; Rezoning; Applicant: Kurt Johnson, Agent for Johnny Evans. Location – 11th Civil District; Parcel 27.00, Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 96, located on Old Clark Road and Hooper Road. Janet Petrunich read the Staff Report and the returned adjoining property owner notices. Due to concerns expressed by the audience, Van Buskirk requested Petrunich give an explanation of the process for developing a Subdivision. Petrunich gave a brief explanation of the process. Mr. Nunley, property owner northwest of the subject property on the east side of Old Clark Road, expressed his opposition due to future increased traffic. Mr. Nunley questioned Petrunich as to whether or not the rezoning would affect the uses allowed on his property. Petrunich offered that the rezoning of the subject property would not affect the uses allowed under the Agricultural zoning of Mr. Nunley's property. There was a brief discussion about the differences in uses that were allowed and prohibited in the Agricultural and R-1 zoned districts. Mr. Nunley again expressed his concerns about increased traffic. Lydia Curtis-Johnson made a motion to recommend for the rezoning from A, Agricultural to R-1, Single Family Residential. John Woodall seconded the motion. All aye.

Dave Van Buskirk introduced Case No. 7-19; Preliminary/Final Plat Review; Applicant: Kurt Johnson. Location – 5th Civil District; Parcel 14.00 (Part), Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 94, located on Post Oak Road, Horseshoe Lane and Glaus Road. Janet Petrunich read the Staff Report. Van Buskirk asked for questions or comments from the board. There was a discussion in regards to the lack of information shown on the plat, such as waterlines, drainage, appropriate setbacks etc... John Woodall made a motion to approve the Preliminary/Final Plat for Zimmerman Acres Subdivision based upon the Staff Report and discussions, subject to the following conditions:

1. The 19.94 acre portion of the property be successfully rezoned to R-1, Single Family Residential.
2. Add the word "Part" following the Parcel number
3. Label "Remaining Acreage" on the plat.
4. Note the proposed R-1 setbacks on the plat.

5. Show the Front Minimum Building Setback Line for the R-1 zoned district on all lots.
6. Show the west property line dimensions for Lots 4 and 5.
7. Show existing water line on the plat, include line size.
8. Show proposed utility layouts showing connections to existing or proposed utility systems, including line size.
9. Show or note any existing or proposed easements (e.g. electrical, drainage).
10. Contours, acceptable by the Planning Commission, be shown on the plat, unless specifically not required by the Planning Commission.
11. Note or show the location of the nearest fire hydrant.
12. Install a fire hydrant if there is adequate flow and pressure to serve the development.
13. Certificate of Approval of Water Systems be added to the plat and signed.
14. Certificate of Approval for Subsurface Sewage Disposal be added to the plat and signed with restrictions, if any.
15. Certificate of Approval of Roads be corrected (add Horseshoe Lane) and signed.
16. Certificate of Ownership and Dedication be signed.
17. Certificate of Approval for Subdivisions and Road Name(s) be signed.

Michael Rudder seconded the motion. All aye.

Dave Van Buskirk introduced Case No. 8-19; Preliminary/Final Plat Review; Applicant: Kurt Johnson, Agent for Johnny Evans. Location – 11th Civil District; Parcel 27.00, Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 96, located on Old Clark Road and Hooper Road; Janet Petrunich read the Staff Report. Petrunich pointed out that there were no drainage easements shown on the plat. Petrunich and Woodall offered that there was an existing culvert located between Lots 7 and 8 that was not shown on the plat. There was a brief discussion about drainage problems in the county and the lack of drainage easements/plans shown on subdivision plats. Michael Rudder made a motion to approve the Preliminary/Final Plat for Clark Acres Subdivision based upon the Staff Report and discussions, subject to the following conditions:

1. The property be successfully rezoned to R-1, Single Family Residential.
2. Note the proposed R-1 setbacks on the plat.
3. Show the Front Minimum Building Setback Line for the R-1 zoned district on all lots.
4. Show or note any existing or proposed easements (e.g. electrical, drainage).
5. Contours, acceptable by the Planning Commission, be shown on the plat, unless specifically not required by the Planning Commission.
6. Note or show the location of the nearest fire hydrant.
7. Install a fire hydrant if there is adequate flow and pressure to serve the development.
8. Certificate of Approval of Water Systems be added to plat and signed.
9. Certificate of Approval for Subsurface Sewage Disposal be added to the plat and signed with restrictions, if any.
10. Certificate of Ownership and Dedication be signed.
11. Certificate of Approval for Subdivisions and Road Name(s) be signed.
12. Certificate of Roads be signed.
13. Show drainage plan on plat.

David James seconded the motion. All aye.

Dave Van Buskirk introduced Case No. 9-19; Preliminary/Final Plat Review; Applicant: Pat Sanders, Agent for Fanning Bend Inc. Location – 2nd Civil District; Parcel 28.01 (Part), Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 53, located on Fanning Bend Drive. Janet Petrunich read the Staff Report. Petrunich gave a brief explanation of the definition of a Cluster Development. John Woodall made a motion to approve the Preliminary/Final Plat for Fanning Bend Phase III Subdivision based

upon the Staff Report and discussions, subject to the following conditions:

1. Change "Preliminary Plat" to "Preliminary/Final Plat".
2. Note the correct ownership and address of owner.
3. Note the Franklin County Tax Map and Parcel number.
4. Note the correct zoning classification as R-2, General Residential Cluster Residential Development (Subdivided).
5. Note the correct setbacks for an R-2, General Residential (Cluster Residential Development).
6. Re-number Lots in numerical order. (Start with 151(?))
7. Note the correct remaining acreage.
8. Show the correct Front Minimum Building Setback Line on each lot.
9. Show proposed utility layouts showing connections to existing or proposed utility systems, including line size.
10. The correct Certificate of Approval of Water System be added and signed.
11. The correct Certificate of Approval of Sewerage System be added and signed.
12. The correct Certificate of Approval of Roads (surety/bond) be added and signed.
13. Certificate of Accuracy be signed.
14. Certificate of Ownership and Dedication be signed.
15. Certificate of Approval for Subdivisions and Road Name(s) be signed.
16. Change name of Subdivision to "Fanning Bend Phase III".

David James seconded the motion. All aye.

Janet Petrunich offered that she was working on several amendments to the Franklin County Zoning Resolution and Subdivision Regulations to be presented to the Planning Commission at a future meeting.

Under Old Business, Janet Petrunich re-introduced Case No. 12-18; Final Subdivision Plat Review; Applicant: Henry Ingram, Agent for Tims Ford North Development LLC. Location – 14th Civil District; Parcel 15.00, Franklin County, TN Property Map No. 32, located on Evans Drive. Petrunich offered that the developer was requesting a revision to The Reserve at Holiday Landing Subdivision Final Plat (recorded on January 25, 2019), specifically for the purpose of relocating the twenty foot Ingress/Egress Easement (to access the common area) currently shown on Lots 46 and 47 to Lots 54 and 55. Petrunich offered a letter from the developer which stated that none of the subject lots had transferred ownership, and would not, until the revised Final Plat was approved and recorded. There was a brief discussion. John Woodall made a motion to approve the revision to The Reserve at Holiday Landing Subdivision Final Plat as requested. Michael Rudder seconded the motion. All aye.

John Woodall gave an update on the roadway work, soon to be started, in the reconstruction of the intersection at Pine Bluff Road and Old Tullahoma Road (Highway 130).

The meeting adjourned at 7:10PM by Chairman Dave Van Buskirk.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Alexander.

1. Director of Schools, Stanley Bean presented the BOE budget. Commissioner Eldridge presented graphs showing history of revenues and expenditures over the past 5 years. ***MOTION** by Bean to approve the Board of Education's budget as presented. Motion failed lack of second. Bean then asked the committee for direction. Committee was concerned over ending fund balance for future years. Director Smith asked the committee to give the BOE a target in order to meet their budget. ***MOTION** by Riddle to accept the BOE budget and work on cutting budget in order to prepare for next year. The vote resulted in Ayes from Alexander, Eldridge, Finney, Woodall, Riddle and Wiseman and Nay from Bean. Motion carried.
3. ***MOTION** by Bean, second by Woodall to approve the County year-end amendment that was let off at last meeting. The vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried.
4. Director Smith made the committee aware that the Drug Fund Budget will need to be amended and it will reflect in the consolidated budget.
5. Director Smith presented an update on the Jail Expansion Debt Service needs. They will need to issue a capital outlay note for \$2 million in order to complete the jail project. ***MOTION** by Eldridge, second by Riddle to forward the request to the full commission to start the process to issue debt in the amount of two million dollars to complete the jail project. Vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried.
6. Commissioner Stines, representative of Rural Fire asked that the hotel-motel and other revenues stays as is currently and to allow their fund balance to remain. The ability to reserve funds to pay out in larger sums allows the purchase of expensive equipment needed by the fire departments. To outfit one fireman cost around \$10,000 and the purchase of a used firetruck can run around \$250,000.
7. Gary Clardy, project manager for the middle schools gave an update to the committee. The gyms are progressing and almost 100% on pads at both locations.

A special called meeting will be scheduled for June 24th at 7 pm to approve a resolution to start the debt obligation of the \$2 million and also to address any year-end amendment(s) or issues needed to prepare for the close of the fiscal year.

There being no further business ***MOTION** by Woodall, second by Riddle to adjourn the meeting at 11:10 AM. The vote resulted in all ayes, motion carried.

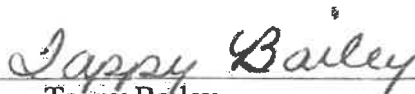

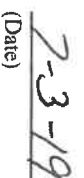

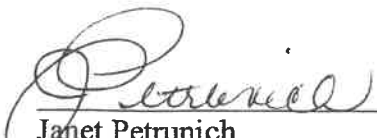

4th Quarter Report FY 2018-2019

- We are right in the middle of re-doing Winchester Springs convenience center. Initial re-opening was to be July 5th however now; we are shooting for August 1st. A delay in rain, fencing, and getting the new compactor installed has significantly hindered us from meeting our timeline. The center will be state of the art upon completion and should greatly minimize write-ups from the state for non-compliance.
- At our last Franklin County Solid Waste Control Board meeting the board expressed their sincere desire to proceed with establishing a Waste-To-Energy facility in Franklin County. I have begun the process of fulfilling their request. The board wants a facility that will pay the monthly bond payments in full so there is no burden on the county and with time will be a very large income producer for the county for many years to come. Town hall meetings will hopefully be conducted in the fall. Please become informed on this topic so that you can answer questions of your constituents. I am available to answer any of your questions at any time. Hopefully by this time next year we will have a proposal in front of the full commission for your decision.
- This year we took a budget shortfall of revenue of about \$55,000 dollars from the sale of recycled material. I expect this number to be about \$70,000 dollars in the next fiscal year. Time and patience will hopefully prevail as the market continues to adjust; although, I am hoping that we have hit the bottom of the price fall-out currently.
- Budget is attached and shows we are where we need to be at this time of year. The \$90,000 dollars shown still has outstanding P.O.(s) and other expenses listed against it. I predict that we will be very close on the budget when it is finalized at year end.

Franklin County Community Reentry thanks the Franklin County Commission for the opportunity to serve citizens incarcerated in Franklin County Jail. The services provided during this quarter has led to the following results.

Number served - 27 individuals for quarter – 57 year to date

Number still incarcerated after programming – 17 year to date

Number released from jail - 40

Number receiving in-house long term aftercare treatment – 1 this quarter – 2 year to date

Number of clients placed in full time employment – 16 this quarter – 22 year to date – 19 still employed for this total six month period.

Average hourly rate per person is \$12.69, or \$26,404.00 annually.

Total weekly wages for the 22 individuals placed in employment are \$11,171.00.

Total projected annual wages for these individuals will be \$580,892.00.

Christine Hopkins, Reentry Executive Director has been appointed by Governor Lee's administration to represent Reentry and Workforce on a special subcommittee for State Reentry Recommendations. Christine is serving with five other individuals to complete the recommendations to the Governor by August, 2019.

Working with the Sheriff's Department, the Reentry program staff is helping to increase the number of individuals on work release. The individuals currently on work release will be leaving the jail with a major step made toward payment of their fines and full-time employment.

Reentry's mission of lowering recidivism and returning productive individuals to society continues to progress in providing for a safer community.

This Grant Contract, by and between the State of Tennessee, Department of Children's Services (DCS), hereinafter referred to as the "State" and Franklin County Trustee hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee," is for the provision of State Supplement Juvenile Court Improvement Funds, as further defined in the "SCOPE OF SERVICES."

Grantee Edison Vendor ID # 4189

A. SCOPE OF SERVICES:

- A.1. The Grantee shall provide all service and deliverables as required, described, and detailed herein and shall meet all service and delivery timelines as specified by this Grant Contract.
- A.2. The Grant may be used to meet the local and state matching requirement in whole or in part for federal juvenile justice funds to employ a Youth Services Officer.
- A.3. The Grantee shall employ or have in its employ a Youth Services Officer to be appointed and supervised by the court exercising juvenile jurisdiction. For the county to be eligible to receive these funds, Youth Services Officer employed by the county shall meet the requirements specified below. The juvenile court shall provide the county or the Tennessee Department of Children's Services upon request, with written documentation that the Youth Services Officer meets these requirements:
- A.3.a. **Qualifications.** A Youth Services Officer shall have completed sixty (60) semester hours or ninety (90) quarter hours of undergraduate credit from an accredited college or university with the major area of study in juvenile justice, criminal justice or a social science related field. For Youth Services Officers, priority consideration should be given to applicants with fifteen (15) or more semester hours or twenty-two (22) or more quarter hours in the area of psychology, sociology, criminal justice, social work, guidance and counseling, or a related field. The juvenile court shall provide upon request an official transcript for any Youth Services Officer appointed by the court.
- A.3.b. **Employment Status.** The juvenile court shall submit written documentation to the county or the Tennessee Department of Children's Services of the number of hours worked by the Youth Services Officer. Definitions of full-time and part-time employment shall be as follows:
1. A full-time Youth Services Officer shall work the number of hours designated by the county as full-time.
 2. A part-time Youth Services Officer shall work at least 18.5 hours per week.
- A.3.c. **Training.** In the first year of employment a Youth Services Officer will complete forty hours (40) of training approved by the Tennessee Department of Children's Services. After the first year of employment, each Youth Services Officer will complete a total of twenty (20) hours of training each fiscal year. In a county where there is more than one Youth Service Officer (YSO), each YSO will complete fifteen (15) hours of annual training. YSO Supervisors or part-time YSO's will complete fifteen (15) hours of annual training each fiscal year.
- A.3.d. **Duties.** The duties of a Youth Services Officer shall be those described in the Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 37-1-106. Courts using these funds shall submit record-keeping forms each month to the Tennessee Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges as required by the Council.
- A.4. The Grantee shall submit Tennessee Department of Children's Services Office of Juvenile Justice State Supplement Funds Bi-Annual Report (Attachment A) a report on a form provided by the Tennessee Department of Children's Services describing quarterly expenditures, whether the

- Youth Services Officer is a full-time or part-time employee, the number of hours worked during the quarter by the Youth Services Officer, information about the training received by the Youth Services Officer and a statement of impact on improving juvenile court services.
- A.4.a. The juvenile court shall, upon request, provide the county with information necessary to complete this report.
- A.4.b. Bi-Annual reports shall be due on or before January 15 and July 15.
- A.4.c. The Tennessee Department of Children's Services may contact any county during the fiscal year to inquire into and evaluate the county's use of funds.
- A.4.d. Failure to submit Bi-annual reports may result in loss of state juvenile justice supplement funds for the immediately following fiscal year.
- A.5. The Grantee shall provide, in counties where more than one court exercises juvenile jurisdiction, each juvenile court with an equitable share of the county's allocation as determined by percentage of juvenile intakes or some other appropriate measure approved by the Deputy Commissioner of Juvenile Justice of the Tennessee Department of Children's Services.
- A.6. The Grantee shall pool, if mutually desired, with another county, state juvenile justice supplements for use in projects to improve juvenile court services in the affected counties.
- A.7. The Grantee shall comply with all applicable rules of the Tennessee Department of Children's Services currently in effect or as amended from time to time.
- A.8. The Grantee shall use state juvenile justice supplement funds to improve juvenile court services and/or to provide community alternatives to detention. The juvenile court shall provide the county or the Tennessee Department of Children's Services upon request, the information necessary to verify that these funds were expended in accordance with these rules. These funds shall not be expended as set out below:
 - a. The funds appropriated to a county in a given fiscal year shall not be used to supplant county expenditures for juvenile court services made in that or any other fiscal year.
 - b. The funds shall not be used in construction of or remodeling of jail facilities where any adults alleged to have committed or who have been convicted of a criminal offense are detained.

B. CONTRACT PERIOD:

This Grant Contract shall be effective for the period beginning July 1, 2019, and ending on June 30, 2024. The Grantee hereby acknowledges and affirms that the State shall have no obligation to the Grantee for fulfillment of the Scope outside the Term.

C. PAYMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- C.1. Maximum Liability. In no event shall the maximum liability of the State under this Grant Contract exceed Forty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000.00). The Grant Budget, attached and incorporated hereto as Attachment B shall constitute the maximum amount due the Grantee for all service and Grantee obligations hereunder. The Grant Budget line-items include, but are not limited to, all applicable taxes, fees, overhead, and all other direct and indirect costs incurred or to be incurred by the Grantee.
- C.2. Compensation Firm. The maximum liability of the State is not subject to escalation for any reason unless amended. The Grant Budget amounts are firm for the duration of the Grant Contract and are not subject to escalation for any reason unless amended, except as provided in section C.6.

- C.3. Payment Methodology. The Grantee shall be reimbursed for actual, reasonable, and necessary costs based upon the Grant Budget, not to exceed the maximum liability established in section C.1. Upon progress toward the completion of the work, as described in section A of this Grant Contract, the Grantee shall submit invoices prior to any reimbursement of allowable costs.
- C.4. Travel Compensation. Reimbursement to the Grantee for travel, meals, or lodging shall be subject to amounts and limitations specified in the "State Comprehensive Travel Regulations," as they are amended from time to time, and shall be contingent upon and limited by the Grant Budget funding for said reimbursement.
- C.5. Invoice Requirements. The Grantee shall invoice the State no more often than monthly, with all necessary supporting documentation, and present such as Attachment C to:

- a. Each invoice shall clearly and accurately detail all of the following required information (calculations must be extended and totaled correctly).
- (1) Invoice/Reference Number (assigned by the Grantee).
 - (2) Invoice Date.
 - (3) Invoice Period (to which the reimbursement request is applicable).
 - (4) Grant Contract Number (assigned by the State).
 - (5) Grantor: Department of Children's Services, Juvenile Court Prevention Services.
 - (6) Grantor Number (assigned by the Grantee to the above-referenced Grantor).
 - (7) Grantee Name.
 - (8) Grantee Tennessee Edison Registration ID Number Referenced in Preamble of this Grant Contract.
 - (9) Grantee Remittance Address.
 - (10) Grantee Contact for Invoice Questions (name, phone, and/or fax).
 - (11) Itemization of Reimbursement Requested for the Invoice Period— it must detail, at minimum, all of the following:
 - i. The amount requested by Grant Budget line-item (including any travel expenditure reimbursement requested and for which documentation and receipts, as required by "State Comprehensive Travel Regulations," are attached to the invoice).
 - ii. The amount reimbursed by Grant Budget line-item to date.
 - iii. The total amount reimbursed under the Grant Contract to date.
 - iv. The total amount requested (all line-items) for the Invoice Period.
- b. The Grantee understands and agrees to all of the following.
- (1) An invoice under this Grant Contract shall include only reimbursement requests for actual, reasonable, and necessary expenditures required in the delivery of service described by this Grant Contract and shall be subject to the Grant Budget and any other provision of this Grant Contract relating to allowable reimbursements.
 - (2) An invoice under this Grant Contract shall not include any reimbursement request for future expenditures.
 - (3) An invoice under this Grant Contract shall initiate the timeframe for reimbursement only when the State is in receipt of the invoice, and the invoice meets the minimum requirements of this section C.5.

- (4) An invoice under this Grant Contract shall be presented to the State within thirty (30) days after the end of the calendar month in which the subject costs were incurred or services were rendered by the Grantee. An invoice submitted more than thirty (30) days after such date will NOT be paid. The State will not deem such Grantee costs to be allowable and reimbursable by the State unless, at the sole discretion of the State, the failure to submit a timely invoice is warranted. The Grantee shall submit a special, written request for reimbursement with any such untimely invoice. The request must detail the reason the invoice is untimely as well as the Grantee's plan for submitting future invoices as required, and it must be signed by a Grantee agent that would be authorized to sign this Grant Contract.
- C.6. Budget Line-items. Expenditures, reimbursements, and payments under this Grant Contract shall adhere to the Grant Budget. The Grantee may vary from a Grant Budget line-item amount by up to **twenty percent (20%)** of the line-item amount, provided that any increase is off-set by an equal reduction of other line-item amount(s) such that the net result of variances shall not increase the total Grant Contract amount detailed by the Grant Budget. Any increase in the Grant Budget grand total amounts shall require an amendment of this Grant Contract.
- C.7. Disbursement Reconciliation and Close Out. The Grantee shall submit any final invoice and a grant disbursement reconciliation report within sixty (60) days of the Grant Contract end date and in form and substance acceptable to the State.
- a. If total disbursements by the State pursuant to this Grant Contract exceed the amounts permitted by the section C, payment terms and conditions of this Grant Contract, the Grantee shall refund the difference to the State. The Grantee shall submit said refund with the final grant disbursement reconciliation report.
 - b. The State shall not be responsible for the payment of any invoice submitted to the state after the grant disbursement reconciliation report. The State will not deem any Grantee costs submitted for reimbursement after the grant disbursement reconciliation report to be allowable and reimbursable by the State, and such invoices will NOT be paid.
 - c. The Grantee's failure to provide a final grant disbursement reconciliation report to the state as required shall result in the Grantee being deemed ineligible for reimbursement under this Grant Contract, and the Grantee shall be required to refund any and all payments by the state pursuant to this Grant Contract.
 - d. The Grantee must close out its accounting records at the end of the contract period in such a way that reimbursable expenditures and revenue collections are NOT carried forward.
- C.8. Indirect Cost. Should the Grantee request reimbursement for indirect cost, the Grantee must submit to the State a copy of the indirect cost rate approved by the cognizant federal agency and the State. The Grantee will be reimbursed for indirect cost in accordance with the approved indirect cost rate and amounts and limitations specified in the attached Grant Budget. Once the Grantee makes an election and treats a given cost as direct or indirect, it must apply that treatment consistently and may not change during the contract period. Any changes in the approved indirect cost rate must have prior approval of the cognizant federal agency and the State. If the indirect cost rate is provisional during the period of this agreement, once the rate becomes final, the Grantee agrees to remit any overpayment of funds to the State, and subject to the availability of funds the State agrees to remit any underpayment to the Grantee.
- C.9. Cost Allocation. If any part of the costs to be reimbursed under this Grant Contract are joint costs involving allocation to more than one program or activity, such costs shall be allocated and reported in accordance with the provisions of Department of Finance and Administration Policy Statement 03 or any amendments or revisions made to this policy statement during the contract period.

- C.10. Payment of Invoice. A payment by the State shall not prejudice the State's right to object to or question any reimbursement, invoice, or matter in relation thereto. A payment by the State shall not be construed as acceptance of any part of the work or service provided or as approval of any amount as an allowable cost.
- C.11. Unallowable Costs. Any amounts payable to the Grantee shall be subject to reduction for amounts included in any invoice or payment theretofore made, which are determined by the State, on the basis of audits or monitoring conducted in accordance with the terms of this Grant Contract, not to constitute allowable costs.
- C.12. State's Right to Set Off. The State reserves the right to set off or deduct from amounts that are or shall become due and payable to the Grantee under this Grant Contract or under any other agreement between the Grantee and the State of Tennessee under which the Grantee has a right to receive payment from the State.
- C.13. Prerequisite Documentation. The Grantee shall not invoice the State under this Grant Contract until the State has received the following documentation properly completed.
- a. The Grantee shall complete, sign, and present to the State an "Authorization Agreement for Automatic Deposit (ACH Credits) Form" provided by the State. By doing so, the Grantee acknowledges and agrees that, once said form is received by the State, all payments to the Grantee, under this or any other contract the Grantee has with the State of Tennessee shall be made by Automated Clearing House (ACH).
 - b. The Grantee shall complete, sign, and present to the State a "Substitute W-9 Form" provided by the State. The taxpayer identification number detailed by said form must agree with the Federal Employer Identification Number or Social Security Number referenced in this Grant Contract or the Grantee's Tennessee Edison Registration.

D. STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- D.1. Required Approvals. The State is not bound by this Grant Contract until it is signed by the contract parties and approved by appropriate officials in accordance with applicable Tennessee laws and regulations (depending upon the specifics of this contract, said officials may include, but are not limited to, the Commissioner of Finance and Administration, the Commissioner of Human Resources, and the Comptroller of the Treasury).
- D.2. Modification and Amendment. Except as specifically provided herein, this Grant Contract may be modified only by a written amendment signed by all parties hereto and approved by both the officials who approved the base contract and, depending upon the specifics of the contract as amended, any additional officials required by Tennessee laws and regulations (said officials may include, but are not limited to, the Commissioner of Finance and Administration, the Commissioner of Human Resources, and the Comptroller of the Treasury).
- D.3. Termination for Convenience. The State may terminate this Grant Contract without cause for any reason. A termination for convenience shall not be a breach of this Grant Contract by the State. The State shall give the Grantee at least thirty (30) days written notice before the effective termination date. The Grantee shall be entitled to compensation for authorized expenditures and satisfactory services completed as of the termination date, but in no event shall the State be liable to the Grantee for compensation for any service that has not been rendered. The final decision as to the amount for which the State is liable shall be determined by the State. The Grantee shall not have any right to any actual general, special, incidental, consequential, or any other damages whatsoever of any description or amount for the State's exercise of its right to terminate for convenience.
- D.4. Termination for Cause. If the Grantee fails to properly perform its obligations under this Grant Contract in a timely or proper manner, or if the Grantee violates any terms of this Grant Contract, the State shall have the right to immediately terminate the Grant Contract and withhold payments in excess of fair compensation for completed services. Notwithstanding the above, the Grantee

shall not be relieved of liability to the State for damages sustained by virtue of any breach of this Grant Contract by the Grantee.

- D.5. Subcontracting. The Grantee shall not assign this Grant Contract or enter into a subcontract for any of the services performed under this Grant Contract without obtaining the prior written approval of the State. If such subcontracts are approved by the State, each shall contain, at a minimum, sections of this Grant Contract pertaining to "Conflicts of Interest," "Lobbying," "Nondiscrimination," "Public Accountability," "Public Notice," and "Records" (as identified by the section headings). Notwithstanding any use of approved subcontractors, the Grantee shall remain responsible for all work performed.
- D.6. Conflicts of Interest. The Grantee warrants that no part of the total Grant Amount shall be paid directly or indirectly to an employee or official of the State of Tennessee as wages, compensation, or gifts in exchange for acting as an officer, agent, employee, subcontractor, or consultant to the Grantee in connection with any work contemplated or performed relative to this Grant Contract.
- D.7. Lobbying. The Grantee certifies, to the best of its knowledge and belief, that:
- a. No federally appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of an agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.
 - b. If any funds other than federally appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the Grantee shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure of Lobbying Activities," in accordance with its instructions.
 - c. The Grantee shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all sub-awards at all tiers (including sub-contracts, sub-grants, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreements) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

- D.9. Subject to Funds Availability. This Grant Contract is subject to the appropriation and availability of State or Federal funds. - D.11. HIPAA Compliance. The State and the Grantee shall comply with obligations under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act (HITECH) and any other relevant laws and regulations regarding privacy (collectively the "Privacy Rules"). The obligations set forth in this Section shall survive the termination of this Grant Contract.
- a. The Grantee warrants to the State that it is familiar with the requirements of the Privacy Rules and will comply with all applicable HIPAA requirements in the course of this Grant Contract.
 - b. The Grantee warrants that it will cooperate with the State, including cooperation and coordination with State privacy officials and other compliance officers required by the Privacy Rules, in the course of performance of this Grant Contract so that both parties will be in compliance with the Privacy Rules.
 - c. The State and the Grantee will sign documents, including but not limited to business associate agreements, as required by the Privacy Rules and that are reasonably necessary to keep the State and the Grantee in compliance with the Privacy Rules. This provision shall not apply if information received by the State under this Grant Contract is NOT "protected health information" as defined by the Privacy Rules, or if the Privacy Rules permit the State to receive such information without entering into a business associate agreement or signing another such document.
- D.12. Public Accountability. If the Grantee is subject to *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Title 8, Chapter 4, Part 4, or if this Grant Contract involves the provision of services to citizens by the Grantee on behalf of the State, the Grantee agrees to establish a system through which recipients of services

may present grievances about the operation of the service program, and the Grantee shall display in a prominent place, located near the passageway through which the public enters in order to receive Grant supported services, a sign at least twelve inches (12") in height and eighteen inches (18") in width stating:

NOTICE: THIS AGENCY IS A RECIPIENT OF TAXPAYER FUNDING. IF YOU OBSERVE AN AGENCY DIRECTOR OR EMPLOYEE ENGAGING IN ANY ACTIVITY WHICH YOU CONSIDER TO BE ILLEGAL, IMPROPER, OR WASTEFUL, PLEASE CALL THE STATE COMPTROLLER'S TOLL-FREE HOTLINE: 1-800-232-5454

- D.13. **Public Notice.** All notices, informational pamphlets, press releases, research reports, signs, and similar public notices prepared and released by the Grantee in relation to this Grant Contract shall include the statement, "This project is funded under a grant contract with the State of Tennessee." All notices by the Grantee in relation to this Grant Contract shall be approved by the State.
- D.14. **Licensure.** The Grantee and its employees and all sub-grantees shall be licensed pursuant to all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations and shall upon request provide proof of all licenses.
- D.15. **Records.** The Grantee and any approved subcontractor shall maintain documentation for all charges under this Grant Contract. The books, records, and documents of the Grantee and any approved subcontractor, insofar as they relate to work performed or money received under this Grant Contract, shall be maintained in accordance with applicable Tennessee law. In no case shall the records be maintained for a period of less than five (5) full years from the date of the final payment. The Grantee's records shall be subject to audit at any reasonable time and upon reasonable notice by the Grantor State Agency, the Comptroller of the Treasury, or their duly appointed representatives.

The records shall be maintained in accordance with Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Accounting Standards or the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification, as applicable, and any related AICPA Industry Audit and Accounting guides.

In addition, documentation of grant applications, budgets, reports, awards, and expenditures will be maintained in accordance with U.S. Office of Management and Budget's *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards*.

Grant expenditures shall be made in accordance with local government purchasing policies and procedures and purchasing procedures for local governments authorized under state law.

The Grantee shall also comply with any recordkeeping and reporting requirements prescribed by the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury.

The Grantee shall establish a system of internal controls that utilize the COSO Internal Control - Integrated Framework model as the basic foundation for the internal control system. The Grantee shall incorporate any additional Comptroller of the Treasury directives into its internal control system.

Any other required records or reports which are not contemplated in the above standards shall follow the format designated by the head of the Grantor State Agency, the Central Procurement Office, or the Commissioner of Finance and Administration of the State of Tennessee.

- D.16. **Monitoring.** The Grantee's activities conducted and records maintained pursuant to this Grant Contract shall be subject to monitoring and evaluation by the State, the Comptroller of the Treasury, or their duly appointed representatives.
- D.17. **Progress Reports.** The Grantee shall submit brief, periodic, progress reports to the State as requested.
- D.18. **Annual and Final Reports.** The Grantee shall submit, within three (3) months of the conclusion of each year of the Term, an annual report. For grant contracts with a term of less than one (1) year,

the Grantee shall submit a final report within three (3) months of the conclusion of the Term. For grant contracts with multiyear terms, the final report will take the place of the annual report for the final year of the Term. The Grantee shall submit annual and final reports to the Grantor State Agency and the Department of Finance and Administration ("F&A"). Send electronic copies of annual and final reports to F&A at fa.audit@tn.gov. At minimum, annual and final reports shall include: (a) the Grantee's name; (b) the Grant Contract's Edison identification number, Term, and total amount; (c) a narrative section that describes the program's goals, outcomes, successes and setbacks, whether the Grantee used benchmarks or indicators to determine progress, and whether any proposed activities were not completed; and (d) other relevant details requested by the Grantor State Agency. Annual and final report documents to be completed by the Grantee shall appear on the Grantor State Agency's website or as an attachment to the Grant Contract.

- D.19. **Audit Report.** For purposes of this Section, pass-through entity means a non-federal entity that provides a subaward to a subrecipient to carry out part of a federal program.

The Grantee shall provide audited financial statements to the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury ("Comptroller") if during the Grantee's fiscal year, the Grantee: (1) expends seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) or more in direct and indirect federal financial assistance and the State is a pass-through entity; (2) expends seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) or more in state funds from the State; or (3) expends seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) or more in federal financial assistance and state funds from the State, and the State is a pass-through entity. At least ninety (90) days before the end of its fiscal year, the Grantee shall complete Attachment D (Notice of Audit Report) to notify the State whether or not Grantee is subject to an audit. The Grantee should submit only one, completed Notice of Audit Report document during the Grantee's fiscal year. Any Grantee that is subject to an audit and so indicates on Attachment D (Notice of Audit Report) shall complete Attachment E Parent Child Information document. If the Grantee is subject to an audit, Grantee shall obtain the Comptroller's approval before engaging a licensed, independent public accountant to perform the audit. The Grantee may contact the Comptroller for assistance identifying auditors.

All audits shall be performed in accordance with the Comptroller's requirements, as posted on its web site. When a federal single audit is required, the audit shall be performed in accordance with U.S. Office of Management and Budget's *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards*.

A copy of the audit report shall be provided to the Comptroller by the licensed, independent public accountant. Audit reports shall be made available to the public.

The audit contract between the Grantee and the Auditor shall be on a contract form prescribed by the Comptroller. The Grantee shall be responsible for payment of fees for an audit prepared by a licensed, independent public accountant. Payment of the audit fees by the Grantee shall be subject to the provision relating to such fees contained within this Grant Contract. The Grantee shall be responsible for reimbursing the Comptroller for any costs of an audit prepared by the Comptroller.

- D.20. **Procurement.** If other terms of this Grant Contract allow reimbursement for the cost of goods, materials, supplies, equipment, or contracted services, such procurement shall be made on a competitive basis, including the use of competitive bidding procedures, where practical. The Grantee shall maintain documentation for the basis of each procurement for which reimbursement is paid pursuant to this Grant Contract. In each instance where it is determined that use of a competitive procurement method is not practical, supporting documentation shall include a written justification for the decision and for use of a non-competitive procurement. If the Grantee is a subrecipient, the Grantee shall comply with 2 C.F.R. §§ 200.317—200.326 when procuring property and services under a federal award.

The Grantee shall obtain prior approval from the State before purchasing any equipment under this Grant Contract.

For purposes of this Grant Contract, the term "equipment" shall include any article of nonexpendable, tangible, personal property having a useful life of more than one year and an acquisition cost which equals or exceeds five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00).

- D.21. Strict Performance. Failure by any party to this Grant Contract to insist in any one or more cases upon the strict performance of any of the terms, covenants, conditions, or provisions of this Grant Contract is not a waiver or relinquishment of any term, covenant, condition, or provision. No term or condition of this Grant Contract shall be held to be waived, modified, or deleted except by a written amendment signed by the parties.
- D.22. Independent Contractor. The parties shall not act as employees, partners, joint venturers, or associates of one another in the performance of this Grant Contract. The parties acknowledge that they are independent contracting entities and that nothing in this Grant Contract shall be construed to create a principal/agent relationship or to allow either to exercise control or direction over the manner or method by which the other transacts its business affairs or provides its usual services. The employees or agents of one party shall not be deemed or construed to be the employees or agents of the other party for any purpose whatsoever.
- D.23. Limitation of State's Liability. The State shall have no liability except as specifically provided in this Grant Contract. In no event will the State be liable to the Grantee or any other party for any lost revenues, lost profits, loss of business, loss of grant funding, decrease in the value of any securities or cash position, time, money, goodwill, or any indirect, special, incidental, punitive, exemplary or consequential damages of any nature, whether based on warranty, contract, statute, regulation, tort (including but not limited to negligence), or any other legal theory that may arise under this Grant Contract or otherwise. The State's total liability under this Grant Contract (including any exhibits, schedules, amendments or other attachments to the Contract) or otherwise shall under no circumstances exceed the Maximum Liability originally established in Section C.1 of this Grant Contract. This limitation of liability is cumulative and not per incident.
- D.24. Force Majeure. "Force Majeure Event" means fire, flood, earthquake, elements of nature or acts of God, wars, riots, civil disorders, rebellions or revolutions, acts of terrorism or any other similar cause beyond the reasonable control of the party except to the extent that the non-performing party is at fault in failing to prevent or causing the default or delay, and provided that the default or delay cannot reasonably be circumvented by the non-performing party through the use of alternate sources, workaround plans or other means. A strike, lockout or labor dispute shall not excuse either party from its obligations under this Grant Contract. Except as set forth in this Section, any failure or delay by a party in the performance of its obligations under this Grant Contract arising from a Force Majeure Event is not a default under this Grant Contract or grounds for termination. The non-performing party will be excused from performing those obligations directly affected by the Force Majeure Event, and only for as long as the Force Majeure Event continues, provided that the party continues to use diligent, good faith efforts to resume performance without delay. The occurrence of a Force Majeure Event affecting Grantee's representatives, suppliers, subcontractors, customers or business apart from this Grant Contract is not a Force Majeure Event under this Grant Contract. Grantee will promptly notify the State of any delay caused by a Force Majeure Event (to be confirmed in a written notice to the State within one (1) day of the inception of the delay) that a Force Majeure Event has occurred, and will describe in reasonable detail the nature of the Force Majeure Event. If any Force Majeure Event results in a delay in Grantee's performance longer than forty-eight (48) hours, the State may, upon notice to Grantee: (a) cease payment of the fees until Grantee resumes performance of the affected obligations; or (b) immediately terminate this Grant Contract or any purchase order, in whole or in part, without further payment except for fees then due and payable. Grantee will not increase its charges under this Grant Contract or charge the State any fees other than those provided for in this Grant Contract as the result of a Force Majeure Event.
- D.25. Tennessee Department of Revenue Registration. The Grantee shall comply with all applicable registration requirements contained in Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 67-6-601 – 608. Compliance with applicable registration requirements is a material requirement of this Grant Contract.
- D.26. Charges to Service Recipients Prohibited. The Grantee shall not collect any amount in the form of fees or reimbursements from the recipients of any service provided pursuant to this Grant Contract.

- D.27. No Acquisition of Equipment or Motor Vehicles. This Grant Contract does not involve the acquisition and disposition of equipment or motor vehicles acquired with funds provided under this Grant Contract.
- D.28. State and Federal Compliance. The Grantee shall comply with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations in the performance of this Grant Contract. The U.S. Office of Management and Budget's Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards is available here: http://www.ecfr.gov/cgi-bin/text-idx?SID=c6b2f053952359ba94470ad3a7c1a975&tpl=/ecfrbrowse/Title02/2cfr200_main_02.tpl
- D.29. Governing Law. This Grant Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee, without regard to its conflict or choice of law rules. The Grantee agrees that it will be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Tennessee in actions that may arise under this Grant Contract. The Grantee acknowledges and agrees that any rights or claims against the State of Tennessee or its employees hereunder, and any remedies arising there from, shall be subject to and limited to those rights and remedies, if any, available under Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 9-8-101 through 9-8-408.
- D.30. Completeness. This Grant Contract is complete and contains the entire understanding between the parties relating to the subject matter contained herein, including all the terms and conditions of the parties' agreement. This Grant Contract supersedes any and all prior understandings, representations, negotiations, and agreements between the parties relating hereto, whether written or oral.
- D.31. Severability. If any terms and conditions of this Grant Contract are held to be invalid or unenforceable as a matter of law, the other terms and conditions hereof shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect. To this end, the terms and conditions of this Grant Contract are declared severable.
- D.32. Headings. Section headings are for reference purposes only and shall not be construed as part of this Grant Contract.
- D.33. Iran Divestment Act. The requirements of Tenn. Code Ann. § 12-12-101, *et seq.*, addressing contracting with persons as defined at Tenn. Code Ann. §12-12-103(5) that engage in investment activities in Iran, shall be a material provision of this Grant Contract. The Grantee certifies, under penalty of perjury, that to the best of its knowledge and belief that it is not on the list created pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 12-12-106.
- D.34. Debarment and Suspension. The Grantee certifies, to the best of its knowledge and belief, that it, its current and future principals, its current and future subcontractors and their principals:
- a. are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any federal or state department or agency;
 - b. have not within a three (3) year period preceding this Grant Contract been convicted of, or had a civil judgment rendered against them from commission of fraud, or a criminal offence in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (federal, state, or local) transaction or grant under a public transaction; violation of federal or state antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification, or destruction of records; making false statements, or receiving stolen property;
 - c. are not presently indicted or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a government entity (federal, state, or local) with commission of any of the offenses detailed in section b. of this certification; and

- d. have not within a three (3) year period preceding this Grant Contract had one or more public transactions (federal, state, or local) terminated for cause or default.

The Grantee shall provide immediate written notice to the State if at any time it learns that there was an earlier failure to disclose information or that due to changed circumstances, its principals or the principals of its subcontractors are excluded or disqualified, or presently fall under any of the prohibitions of sections a-d.

E. SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- E.1. Conflicting Terms and Conditions. Should any of these special terms and conditions conflict with any other terms and conditions of this Grant Contract, these special terms and conditions shall control.
- E.2. Subject to Funds Availability. The Grant Contract is subject to the appropriation and availability of State and/or Federal funds. In the event that the funds are not appropriated or are otherwise unavailable, the State reserves the right to terminate the Grant Contract upon written notice to the Grantee. Said termination shall not be deemed a breach of contract by the State. Upon receipt of the written notice, the Grantee shall cease all work associated with the Grant Contract. Should such an event occur, the Grantee shall be entitled to compensation for all satisfactory and authorized services completed as of the termination date. Upon such termination, the Grantee shall have no right to recover from the State any actual, general, special, incidental, consequential, or any other damages whatsoever of any description or amount.
- E.3. Charges to Service Recipients Prohibited. The Grantee shall not collect any amount in the form of fees or reimbursements from the recipients of any service provided pursuant to this Grant Contract.
- E.4. Confidentiality of Records. Strict standards of confidentiality of records and information shall be maintained in accordance with applicable state and federal law. All material and information, regardless of form, medium or method of communication, provided to the Grantee by the State or acquired by the Grantee on behalf of the State that is regarded as confidential under state or federal law shall be regarded as "Confidential Information." Nothing in this Section shall permit Grantee to disclose any Confidential Information, regardless of whether it has been disclosed or made available to the Grantee due to intentional or negligent actions or inactions of agents of the State or third parties. Confidential Information shall not be disclosed except as required or permitted under state or federal law. Grantee shall take all necessary steps to safeguard the confidentiality of such material or information in conformance with applicable state and federal law.

The obligations set forth in this Section shall survive the termination of this Grant Contract.

- E.5. HIPAA Compliance. The State and the Grantee shall comply with obligations under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and its accompanying regulations.
- a. The Grantee warrants to the State that it is familiar with the requirements of HIPAA and its accompanying regulations, and will comply with all applicable HIPAA requirements in the course of this contract.
- b. The Grantee warrants that it will cooperate with the State, including cooperation and coordination with State privacy officials and other compliance officers required by HIPAA and its regulations, in the course of performance of the grant so that both parties will be in compliance with HIPAA.
- c. The State and the Grantee will sign documents, including but not limited to business associate agreements, as required by HIPAA and that are reasonably necessary to keep the State and the Grantee in compliance with HIPAA. This provision shall not apply if information received by the State under this grant is NOT "protected health information"

as defined by HIPAA, or if HIPAA permits the State to receive such information without entering into a business associate agreement or signing another such document.

- E.6. Environmental Tobacco Smoke. Pursuant to the provisions of the federal "Pro-Children Act of 1994" and the Tennessee "Children's Act for Clean Indoor Air of 1995," the Grantee shall prohibit smoking of tobacco products within any indoor premises in which services are provided to individuals under the age of eighteen (18) years. The Grantee shall post "no smoking" signs in appropriate, permanent sites within such premises. This prohibition shall be applicable during all hours, not just the hours in which children are present. Violators of the prohibition may be subject to civil penalties and fines. This prohibition shall apply to and be made part of any subcontract related to this Grant Contract.
- E.7. Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA). The Grantee must comply with the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) of 2003 (Federal law 42 U.S.C. 15601 et. seq.), with all applicable Federal PREA standards, and with all State policies and standards related to PREA for preventing, detecting, monitoring, investigating, and eradicating any form of sexual abuse within facilities/programs/offices owned, operated, or contracted.
- E.8. Drug -Free Workplace. The Grantee shall provide a drug-free workplace pursuant to the "Drug-Free Workplace Act," 41 U.S.C. §§ 8101 through 8106, and its accompanying regulations.
- E.9. Disclosure of Personally Identifiable Information. The Grantee shall report to the State any instances of unauthorized disclosure of personally identifiable information that come to the attention of the Grantee. Any such report shall be made by the Grantee within twenty-four (24) hours after the instance has come to the attention of the Grantee. The Grantee, at the sole discretion of the State, shall provide no cost credit monitoring services for individuals that are deemed to be part of a potential disclosure. The Grantee shall bear the cost of notification to individuals having personally identifiable information involved in a potential disclosure event, including individual letters or public notice. The remedies set forth in this section are not exclusive and are in addition to any claims or remedies available to the State under this Grant Contract or otherwise available at law.
- E.10. Equal Opportunity. As a condition for receipt of grant funds, the Grantee agrees to comply with 41 C.F. R. § 60-1.4 as that section is amended from time to time during the term.
- E.11. Not a DCS Employee. The Grantee shall inform the client in writing that the Grantee is a private provider and not an employee of the State.
- E.12. Employee Background Checks. Prior to the provision of any services, all personnel that have direct contact with children shall comply with DCS Policy 4.1. Employee Background checks.
- E.13. Criminal Background Check. Prior to the provision of any services for this Grant Contract, all Grantee personnel performing work under this Grant Contract shall provide fingerprint samples to effect a criminal history records check conducted by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation. Fingerprints may only be submitted at DCS approved sites where they can be processed electronically. The Grantee shall be responsible for the payment of all fee(s) for Grantee personnel providing their fingerprint samples and submitting to a criminal history review.
- E.14. State Resource Directory Requirement. The Grantee shall for each of its programs serving children, families, and/or caregivers, create an agency program profile in the designated state resource directory. The State shall notify Grantee when the designated state resource directory is activated and ready for enrollment. Grantee shall have thirty (30) days from the date of notification to enter its agency program profile(s) into the designated resource directory. Grantee shall update its agency program profile(s) in the designated state resource directory at least every six months. In addition, Grantee shall update its agency program profile(s) within ten (10) days of any change in information. The State will monitor all agency program profile(s) for update activity.
- E. 15. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. The Grantee shall adhere to the requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as codified in 42 U.S.C. 2000d, which states that "No person in the United States shall, on the ground of race, color or national origin be excluded from participation

in, be denied the benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance.” The Grantee shall have in place or available a process to assist qualified persons of the provided service who may be limited in their English proficiency (LEP).

The Grantee shall deliver to the State on or before July 31st of each fiscal year an implementation plan that describes the Grantee’s long-range goals and objectives that will guide the Grantee’s efforts to ensure compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 pursuant to the guidelines established by the Tennessee Human Rights Commission’s Title VI Compliance Program. Title VI plans must be submitted no later than July 31st of each year to the Tennessee Department of Children’s Services, Division of Diversity Initiatives.

- E.16. Evidence-Based Programs. Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 37-5-121, the Department of Children’s Services is prohibited from expending state funds on any juvenile justice program or program related to the prevention, treatment or care of delinquent juveniles, including any service model or delivery system in any form or by any name, unless the program is evidence-based. “Evidence-based” means a program or practice that is governed by a program manual or protocol that specifies the nature, quality, and amount of service that constitutes the program; and scientific research using methods that meet high scientific standards for evaluating the effects of such programs must have demonstrated with two (2) or more separate client samples that the program improves client outcomes central to the purpose of the program.

The Grantee and any of the Grantee’s subcontractors shall cooperate with the State in evaluating whether its services are evidence-based or otherwise, and will provide program and service details, efficacy data and any information required or requested by the State, consistent with State and federal law regarding confidentiality, for the purpose of complying with this statute for monitoring and quality control. The Grantee further acknowledges and understands that the intent of the law is to discontinue programs and services that are not supported by the evidence of impartial scientific investigation as outlined by statute, rules and regulations which have been, or may be, promulgated by the Department of Children’s Services. By affixing its signature below, the Grantee understands and agrees that the Department of Children’s Services is compelled by law to terminate this Grant instrument if services with any Grantee or the Grantee’s subcontractor(s) are not proven to be evidence-based and if continuation of this Grant shall cause the Department of Children’s Services not to be in compliance with such statute within the timetable set forth in Tenn. Code Ann. § 37-5-121.

- E.17. Grantee Participation. Grantee Participation amount(s) detailed in the Grant Budget are intended as a goal for the total project, and the amount of actual Grantee Participation expenditures will not impact the maximum amounts reimbursable to the Grantee as detailed by the Grant Budget column, “Grant Contract.”

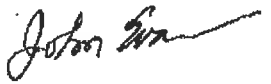

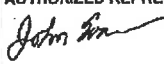
