Mayor Alexander turned the meeting over to Andrea Smith, Finance Director. She walked the Committee through the Tax Assessment Summary and the affect the Certified Tax Rate. In her summary of what is included in the budget she stated the Sheriff has a request to increase Part-Time Deputies. General Sessions Judge is adding one full time Commissioner. Soil Conservation is requesting base increases. Solid Waste and Highway request 5.9% COLA increase per plan and solid waste is requesting for equipment needs. At this time no COLA increase is included in pay lines. Retirement percentage is staying the same and medical insurance will increase 8.3% beginning Jan 2023. She explained that most increases were due to rising costs of fuel and utilities.

Mayor Alexander turned the meeting over to Andrea Smith, Finance Director.

- 1. Robert Baggett presented the budget for the Circuit Court (53100), he is requesting \$1,031,182. This includes an \$8k increase for Victims Assistance in (53900). **Motion** by Eldridge, second by McCurry to approve the Requested Circuit Court budget. The vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried.
- Janet Petrunich presented the Planning & Zoning budget (51720), she is requesting \$210,110 to include adding an additional position to bring the office back up to 3 due to the recent activity.
   \*Motion by Bean, second by Finney to approve the supervisors requested budget. The vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried.
- 3. Scott Smith presented the EMA budget (54410), he is requesting \$168,778. \*Motion by McCurry, second by Finney to approve the requested budget. The vote resulted in all Ayes, the motion carried.
- 4. Scott Smith presented the Rescue budget (54420), he is requesting \$41,000 to match the amount given to rural fire departments. \*Motion by McCurry, second by Bean to approve the requested budget. The vote in all Ayes, motion carried. Mr. Smith also presented the need for an emergency notification system. He presented information to the Committee about possibilities and inquiring where the money would come from, approximately \$8,000 per year, discussion was presented about pulling it from the IT budget, He also asked for \$850 to be paid from the IT budget for GIS license for a mapping system. Eldridge suggested sending the request to the IT committee for research.
- 5. Denise Marshall presented the Register of Deeds budget (51600), she is requesting \$381,059. Commissioner Eldridge raised the question about the progress of digitizing old books, Mrs. Marshall requested the funds to restore them instead of making them digital. \*Motion by Bean, second by McCurry to approve the requested budget. After a roll call vote, Riddle, Finney, Bean, McCurry voted Aye; Eldridge and Alexander voted No, the motion carried 4-2.
- 6. Tina Stevens presented the Library Budget (115), requesting \$448,356. This is a stand-alone budget. \*Motion by McCurry, second by Bean to approve the requested budget. The vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried.
- 7. Greg Ferguson presented the Probation budget (53910), he is requesting \$161,391. \*Motion by Eldridge, second by Riddle to approve the requested budget, the vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried.

- 8. Judge Tom Faris presented the General Sessions budget (53300), he is requesting \$331,064. \*Motion by Riddle, second by McCurry to approve the requested budget. The vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried.
- 9. Judge Tom Faris, also presented the Juvenile Court budget (53500), he is requesting \$138,742. \*Motion by McCurry, second by Finney to approve the requested budget. The vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried.
- 10. Judge Tom Faris, also presented the Court Ordered Mental Health and Juvenile Detention budgets (53900) \$30,000 & (54240) \$42,500. These budgets are driven by need. \*Motion by Finney, second by McCurry to approve the requested budget. The vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried.
- 11. Judge Tom Faris, also presented the Judicial Commissioner budget (53700), he is requesting \$294,277. Judge Farris has requested that the full time judicial commissioners return to salary status to remain competitive for the future. Commissioner Ed Brock addressed the committee to give them some background on the work that the judicial commissioners perform, how their schedule works, and how the schedule could change with an extra full time employee. Judge Faris requested a set annual salary of \$49,000 for each commissioner and adding one more full time commissioner. \*Motion by Bean, second by Riddle to approve adding a new commissioner, making them a salary position, making the new annual salary \$41,000, and approving the adjusted budget of \$257,739. The vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried.
- 12. Bruce Spencer presented the Property Assessor budget (52300), he is requesting \$673,906. \*Motion by Eldridge, second by Riddle to approve the requested budget. The vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried.
- 13. Andrea Smith presented the budget for Rural Fire (120), requesting \$41,000 per each dept. She stated that revenues generally stay the same and the increase is due to the previous resolution. \*Motion by Riddle, second by McCurry to approve the requested budget. The vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried.
- 14. Luke McCurry presented the Highway budget (131), this is a stand-alone budget, they are requesting \$2, 239, 13; which includes the agreed upon COLA increase. \*Motion by Eldridge, second by Riddle to approve the requested budget. The vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried. McCurry and the Highway Commissioners also requested to be considered to receive \$1,250,000 from the Governors Directive and ARP moneys as a match in order to pave both Georgia Crossing and Rock Creek Roads, the highway match will come from their fund balance. \*Motion by Bean, second by Eldridge to approve any remaining balance from ARP money, not to exceed \$1,250,000, be funded to the Highway Dept. The vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried. (After prelim figures there is a remaining \$820,000 in ARP funding)
- 15. Commissioners waived the discussion of the tax rate.
- 16. COLA Discussion, Andrea Smith handed out a sheet showing the difference in adding anywhere from 2-5.9% in COLA salary increases. \*Motion by Riddle, second by Bean to add a 5% COLA increase, the vote resulted in all Ayes, motion carried. Andrea Smith will build the budget with the 5% COLA increase for the purpose of seeing what Tax Rate would be needed with the understanding that that COLA rate could be changed. FD Smith stated that she should have the passed School Board budget Monday night to being to the July 7<sup>th</sup> finance committee.

### RESOLUTION 2-0722

A RESOLUTION TO MAKE APPLICATION FOR A CDBG COVID-19 PROGRAM GRANT THROUGH THE TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TO ASSIST WITH LOCAL CHILDCARE SERVICES.

WHEREAS, Franklin County, Tennessee is eligible for funds under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Covid-19 Program through the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development; and

WHEREAS, many Franklin County companies and industries have indicated they are unable to secure enough workers to adequately operate their businesses; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for more available childcare in Franklin County in order for more able body parents to return to the workforce; and

WHEREAS, Franklin County wishes to make an application for the CDBG Covid-19 project funds grant to assist childcare businesses in their efforts to expand/retain their facilities in order to provide care for more children.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT

- (1) The Mayor be authorized and directed to execute the submission of application for the CDBG-Covid-19 program grant funding to the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development.
- (2) The Mayor be authorized to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with qualified daycare facilities that are eligible for grant funding and have been chosen to receive grant funds based upon a grant scoring system.
- (3) If awarded the Mayor be authorized and directed to receive and enter into all agreements with the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development to receive and administer such grant funds.
- (4) The funding amount is not to exceed three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00) to assist with local childcare services and the grant will be 100% funded by the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development Grant Covid-19 Program requiring no matching of funds from Franklin County, Tennessee.
